

Banned Books Week



Calling all Saville poets! We're on the lookout for poems of all styles – rhyming, free verse, haiku, and more—for the 2015 Banned Books Week Poetry Contest! Create a poem about book banning and your freedom to read or about a character/event in a book that has been on the banned book list. Poems must be submitted by 3:30 on September 30th. One winner from each grade level will receive \$10 worth of material from the next book fair.

POETRY CONTEST GUIDELINES:

1. Poems can be rhyming or non-rhyming, although we find that non-rhyming poetry reads better.
2. Poems must be written about your freedom to read, or a character/event in a book that has been on the banned book list.
3. Poems are judged on the basis of originality and uniqueness.

POETRY CONTEST RULES

4. All entries must be the original creation of the submitting author. All rights to the entries must be owned by the author and shall remain the property of the author. The author gives permission to Saville Middle School to publish and display the entry on the Web (in electronic form only) if the entry is selected as a winner.

HOW TO SUBMIT
