

ELA 6 Book Celebration: One-Pager

A one-pager is a way of responding to a piece of writing on a single sheet of paper. It represents your own written and graphic interpretation of what you have read. It may be very literal (just based on the facts or information in the piece) or it may be a symbolic representation of the piece. It helps you as a reader to visualize what you are reading.

Points	Requirements
5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must be on standard sized (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11), unlined paper and fill the entire page. First and last name and period need to be included.
5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Writing must be in ink or typed... no pencil.
10	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Include the title and the author of the piece.
30	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must have three or more excerpts from the reading.<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Passages that you think are importantb. Page numbers and quotation marks are required.
15	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must include 15 vocabulary words from the book that relate to the theme.• Underline the vocabulary words if they are in the excerpts or personal responses.
15	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must have a graphic representation: drawing, magazine picture, or computer graphic that ties to the piece you read and the quotes you chose (do not use a picture of the book cover).• Must be colored unless the piece demands black and white. You must have an explanation if it is black and white.
20	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must include a personal response - a comment, a connection, an interpretation, or a review—not a summary. (At least 5 sentences using correct conventions)
